Section B: Details in respect of the following

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

- (a) Classes for **Moral and Religious Education programme** that includes Moral and Religious education and chapel activities were held at 9:00 am in Tooker Hall, by Dr. M. Barnabas and Mr. P.K. Solomon. A large number of students attended these classes from 16th Aug. 2011 to 30th Jan. 2012. The annual examination of MRE was held on 31st Jan. 2012.
- (b) Chapel Activities: Each working day of the college started with a short time of prayer and devotion in the college chapel from 9:45 am to 10:00 am. The praise and worship service of the session was held on 8th July 2011. Rev. A. Khandelwal shared the word of God on 8th and 9th July 2011.Many staff members and a large number of students attended the chapel regularly and were blessed by the word of God. The chapel services were conducted by the Christian staff members. A special prayer service was held on 21st Oct 2011 for all the students appearing in the half yearly examination. Christmas function was held on 18th Dec. 2011 in the Tooker Hall. A special Christmas programme for the students was organised on 21st Dec. 2011 at 2:00 p.m. in the Tooker Hall. - (e) Environment Awareness Certificate Programme started in August to make the Part I students aware of the environment and its various parameters. Regular

The students are allotted projects which they have to submit and marks are alloted for it, besides this practical classes are undertaken by taking the students to the Jamuna river to conduct pollution test and study the various parameters of ecosystem and biodiversity. Various competitions are held throughout the year like chart competition, slogan competition, rangoli, flower decoration and skit, AIDs awareness rally and awareness rally regarding HINI virus (swine flu) are taken out from time to time from the college. Mr. Prem Prakash Singh, Scientist, IISc. Bangalore delivered a lecture on "lon Bean Implantation on Cantilever at Nano Scale" on 20th Oct, 2011.Prof. C.M. Bhandari, Retd. Dept. of Physics, AU, Alld.

delivered a lecture on "science communication" on 10th Dec. 2011. National Graduate Physics Examination (NGPE), was organized by IAPT, Pune on 23th Jan. 2012. 16 students were selected as top 10% in the National Graduate Physics Examination 2012.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

- (a) Certificate Course: UGC Sponsored Certificate Course entitled "Analytical Techniques in Chemical Analysis" was started by the department under the 'Career Oriented Scheme' of UGC, New Delhi. Twenty students were enrolled for the said course in which experiments on synthetic and real samples were conducted by the students and they were provided an opportunity to get hands-on experience of UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, Flame Photometer, Colorimeter and other additional supporting equipments beside giving them theoretical knowledge. This course has provided an opportunity to the students in enhancing their own market-worth. The course has also proved vital to students in getting admissions in M.Sc. Instrumentation Chemistry, M.Sc. Analytical Chemistry and such applied courses in various universities and colleges in India.
- (b) Department of Chemistry launched a new Short-Term Course entitled "Mathematics for Chemists". This course aims to provide help to the biology students who have opted Chemistry as one of the subjects in B.Sc III. This course is being run with the collaboration of the teachers of the department of mathematics of E.C.C.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

- (a) One month training on Project development using VB .NET was organized for B. Sc Part III from Dec 2011 to Jan 2012. Experts from Microsoft Corporation delivered a talk in January 2012 relating to world wide competition to be held on Microsoft Office, Institute of Computer Science & Development (ICSD), a renowned IT Organization, conducted a workshop on 'PHP & Linux' and conducted an online examination on 13th January 2012. First, Second and Third position holders were awarded with Laptop, Mobile and Pen Drives respectively.
- (b) A round the year Computer Awareness Programme was conducted for the students of B.A. /B. Sc. Part III 2011-20112 batch. A 36 hrs Training Programme was conducted for the students of B.Ed. 2011-12 batch, from 23rd November 2011, which focused on 'Use of Computers as a Teaching Methodology and Aid.' A 16 hrs. Training Programme was conducted for the students of Biological Techniques & Specimen Preparation, which focused on 'Use of Computers, Internet, Spectrometer and Image Processing.' A 26 hrs. Practical Training was organized for the students of B.Sc. Electronics Part III on 'C' Programming Language.
- (c) This year the Chemistry Department also started consultancy services. Many M.Tech students from SHIATS and Ph.D. student from MNNIT visited the

instrumentation Laboratory of Chemistry Department for analysis of samples and interpretation of data. UV-Vis spectrophotometer, calorimeter, conductometer, etc. were used by the students and data were obtained. The research activity conducted in the department by them will be acknowledged in the research papers and also in the thesis published by the concerned students. We wish to extend this consultancy services as extension activity of the department and make it a regular feature. The department has also generated a small some of income.

4. Total number of seminars/workshops conducted

National conference on 'Chemistry: Role and Challenges' was organised in the College, Prof. Singh, Vice Chancellor, University of Allahabad stressed on the need for quality and high-end researches. Principal, ECC and chairperson of the conference Dr. M. Massey appreciated the efforts of the department of Chemistry. Director, National Centre for Nanoscience and Nanotechnology, Mumbai. Prof. S. Sundar Manoharan, who was the chief guest, spoke on 'Chemistry of metal-organic precursors for photonic materials and devices.'

Department of Ancient History, Culture and Archaeology like previous years organised the Prof. J.S. Negi Memorial lecture on 18 November 2011 in the Conference Hall of the department. Dr. Rajesh Purohit, Director, Allahabad Museum delivered a lecture on 'River and Civilization - Past, Present and Future'. In this lecture he delineated on the various channels of the lost river Saraswati and various archaeological sites particularly of Haryana region. On this occasion Prof Hari Narayan Dubey of Allahabad University was the Chief Guest and Mr. T. D.Souza presided over the function. In the beginning Dr. B.C. Shukla introduced the speaker and chief guest to the audience. Dr. J.P. Upadhyaya conducted the proceedings and Dr. Shivangi Rao proposed a vote of thanks. The next important lecture was delivered by Prof. R.P. Tripathi, Dept. of Ancient History, University of Allahabad on February 2012 in the Tooker Hall of the college, In his lecture Professor Tripathi elaborately highlighted various ideologies which were instrumental in History writing. He analysed in detail the merits and demerits of these trends. The lecture was presided over by the principal of the college, Dr. Mervin Massey. Dr. B.C. Shukla, Head of the Department, welcomed and introduced the topic to the audience. Dr. J.P. Upadhyaya conducted the proceedings and Dr. Shivangi Rao proposed a vote of Thanks.

One Day Seminar: Fifth year in succession, the Department of Chemistry conducted the One Day Seminar for students. About 235 students from various colleges and universities participated. About 60 review articles were submitted by students. In all four technical sessions were conducted and 5 articles in each session were presented. Best presenter in each session was adjudged by the judges and they were awarded with a certificate of merit. Prof. A.C. Pandey, Coordinator, Nanoscience Application Center, University of Allahabad was the Chief Guest and also delivered the key note address. Prof. A. K. Srivastava, Head, Department of Chemistry, University of Allahabad was the Special Guest and Dr. M. Massey, Principal, Ewing Christian College was the Chairman of the seminar.

Department of Economics, Ewing Christian College, organized a Two Day National Seminar on March 11 &12, 2012. The theme of the seminar was "Natural Resources, Economic Development and the Environment". The Seminar was sponsored by University Grants Commission, New Delhi. In the Inaugural Session Prof. Ravi Shankar Srivastava, C.S.R.D., J.N.U., New Delhi graced the occasion as Chief Guest and delivered the Keynote address. He said that thrust should be on equitable development keeping in mind the carrying capacity of the earth. He proposed that the country needs a National Policy framework governing the use of natural resources-sector and economy. A strong land acquisition and rehabilitation policy and a strong and sensible civil society response is an urgent need of the hour.

Sri Ashok Bhagat, Social Worker& Secretary, Vikash Bharti Sodh & Adhyayan Sansthan, Ranchi, Jharkhand presided over the session. He said that lack of equitable system and inappropriate distribution in our society is one of the main causes of hampered development in India. He laid stress on the development of the villages where the real India abides. He said that every environmental issue and problem has a solution but the so-called progressive society does not agree to abide by and implement the solution. Prof. Jagdish Narayan, Head, Dept. of Economics, A.U., Allahabad was Guest of Honour on this occasion. He said that planning process should be such that the exploitation of natural resources judicious should be done in a manner. The proper coordination of policies is a must for suitable utilization of natural resources which are limited and scarce. Dr. M. Massey, Principal & Patron, highlighted the various achievements of the college. He said that the college had started as a PG college and research centre in 1902, and has grown from strength to strength. He highlighted a few areas in which the department of Economics has contributed to the overall growth of academics at university and city level. He said that the college is moving in the right direction to achieve academic excellence. Dr. Umesh Pratap Singh, convener of the seminar, presented the theme paper. He said that till now development has been at the cost of the environment. Since natural resources are limited, development has to be kept in mind. It's high time to now realize that the future of the planet earth is now in our hands and we have to act judiciously keeping in mind the future of our generations. He

said that the solution to this overuse of natural resources can be found in the ancient civilizations of the world where intelligent and judicious use of natural resources is always taken into consideration. He also laid stress on the ancient Indian & Gandhian way of thinking and living for sustainable development.

As it was not possible to build a new library due to restrictions placed by the Allahabad Development Authority, the college took decision to remodel the old library in such a way that the floor area gets doubled. This was achieved by construction of mezzanine floors in the old library building which has now been fully furnished and endowed. An entire floor in the Department of Physics has been constructed to accommodate the Centre for Computer Sciences, which has been equipped with one "State of the Art *e*-**Library**" equipped with over 130 computers with Internet facility for students.

14. Technology up-gradation

The smoothness in functioning is further attributed to the role of Information and Communication Technology (ICT), which has long been successfully implemented in all the processes that are academic or administrative with computerization of Registrar's Officer, Accounts Office, Examination Office and Library, efficiency in operations have increased manifold. To achieve this end, a State-of-art Server Room has been established in the Administrative Block and is made operational under the control of the Computation and Documentation Centre. For seamless connectivity a very strong wi-fi environment has been created covering every nook and crevice of the campus extending up to the classrooms. Another landmark that has been achieved this year is that all the departments are now connected with the college server, enabling the departments to access student records and staff records from their departmental desktops, using the Student Management System and the Staff Management System, specifically designed fro the college.

Training Programmes:

- 3. A 16 hrs. Training Programme was conducted for the students of Biological Techniques & Specimen Preparation, which focused on 'Use of Computers, Internet, Spectrometer and Image Processing.'
- 4. A 26 hrs. Practical Training was organized for the students of B.Sc. Electronics Part III on 'C' Programming Language.

Computing Facilities:

In the process of initiating marketable stuff, the Centre has acquired advanced training techniques & tools, which are also being made available to our students and trainees.

- Lectures and Practical demonstrations are delivered using Multimedia Projectors & OHP's. Both the classrooms are equipped with multimedia projectors and OHP's.
- 2. Both the labs also have Multimedia Projectors. The number of computer systems have increased from 132 to 157, with newly purchased 25 nos HCL Computer Systems with the following configuration: Dual Core, 2GB RAM, 320 GB Hard Disk, 18.5" TFT Monitor, Key Board, Mouse & DVD Writer. The Centre is also equipped with one full fledged HCL Server backed by five online-UPS.
- 3. Computer Based Tutorials (CBTs) are also used for demonstration of difficult topics in the software labs.
- 4. The department is already using BSNL Broadband (2Mbps) connectivity for Internet, as it has become a major source of information in the present scenario. All 157 systems are facilitated with Internet facility.

This workshop was ideally intended for final year undergraduate students from any discipline. 19. Development programmes for non-teaching staff

The College is actively engaged in enhancing the quality of human resources of the College. At present the College is facing problems relating to fresh recruitments due to the new structure of the University under its Central status. Hence the college has initiated various staff training programs for the non teaching staff in the areas of computerized system, accountancy and other administrative scenario relating to online operation of the administrative affairs.

20. Action Taken Report on the AQAR of the previous year

The College took a lead step in introducing PG Courses as suggested by various Committees that inspected the college under different schemes of the UGC. The Committees include Committee for NAAC, Extension of Autonomy, award of the CPE status to the college etc. The College completed all the formalities relating to the introduction of new courses as per the Guidelines for Autonomous Colleges as given by the UGC and the Entrance Test for the admission to new courses were successfully conducted. However the non recognition of the UGC Guidelines by the Ordinance of the University put unmanageable hurdles in the way of the growth of the College. The matter is lying pending in the Allahabad High Court and the college is eagerly waiting for a favorable decision.

Section C: Outcomes achieved by the end of the year

The College has developed the following infrastructure for the launch of the e_learning system inside the College:

- a. A fully dedicated Content Collection Centre for the Collection and Development of e_content
- b. A Media Centre with facilities of Lecture Recording, mixing and preparation of video CD's

- c. A Centralized server with facilities of campus wide dissemination of the e_learning material.
- d. Fully Operational TV sets on strategic points for Centralized telecast of video lectures.

The College has developed the following softwares as a part of the e_Governance system.

- b. Examination Management System
- c. Library Management System

Section D: Plans of the HEI for the next year

The College is eagerly awaiting for the decision of the High Court regarding the launch of the PG Programs in the College. The College plans to launch itself as a research centre and a place of excellence for which the launch of PG Programs is a must. The College has fully developed infrastructure for the development and dissemination of e_learning material in the college. The College aims to start the Content Collection and Development from the coming session. The College also aims to cpmplete its e_governance project by the coming session.
